How then to improve patient safety?


Ily and still prevailing approach to safety Safety I – as little as possible goes wrong The system is safe but people make it unsafe Reactive approach to safety

More recently Safety II – as much as possible goes right The system is unsafe and people create safety Proactive approach to safety

Safety I and Safety II are complementary




