Naloga? Izvajanje konvencionalnih bojnih postopkov ob sočasnem uporabi združenih ognjev.  
Mission? Implementation of conventional combat operations using all armament.

**DT2: TOLMIN**

Naloga? Prehod lastnih enot z namenom stika s sovražnikom.  
Mission? Crossing their own unit positions and neutralizing the opponent.

**DT3: RZENIK**

Naloga? Iskanje ter neutralizacija nasprotnikovih sil, z namenom zagotavljanja pogojev za nadaljnje bojevanje.  
Mission? Neutralizing enemy's forces in order to provide conditions for further combat.

**DT4: RADEČE**

Naloga? Iskanje nasprotnikovih sil, zavzetje/zavarovanje radarja.  
Mission? Movement to contact, seize/secure a radar site.

**DT5: MURA**

Naloga? Urjenje postopkov iskanja in reševanja vojaških oseb v pogojih bitke velikega formata.  
Mission? Training in search and rescue procedures for personnel recovery in MCO conditions.

**DT6: MB LJ CE Divača**

Naloga? Izvajanje nalog specjalnih enot v varovanju, reševanju ter podpori konvencionalnim enotam.  
Mission? Performing SOF tasks in personnel protection, personell recovery and conventional unit support.

Med 17. in 22. majem bo v Republiki Sloveniji že deveto leto zapored mednarodna vojaška vaja Jadranski udar 2021 (angl. Adriatic Strike), na kateri bo Slovenska vojska v sodelovanju z zavezniškimi državami in ob podpori vojaškega letalstva izvedla usposabljanje kontrolorjev združenega ognja.

Novost letošnje vaje je neprekinjeno 72 urno usposabljanje, ki se bo izvajalo v in na širšem območju vojašnic v Mariboru, Celju in Ljubljani ter letališču Divača. Enota velikosti voda bo z usposabljanjem začela v Mariboru v torek, 18. in končala v Divači v četrtek, 20. maja. Usposabljanje bo v nočnem času podpiralo letalo na višinah nad 1000 metrov.

Between 17 and 22 May, the Republic of Slovenia will host the multinational exercise Adriatic Strike 2021 for the ninth consecutive time. In the exercise, the Slovenian Armed Forces will collaborate with 20 other NATO and PfP member states to provide Joint Terminal Attack Controller (JTAC) training with the support of air force capabilities.

This year's addition to the exercise is an uninterrupted 72-hour training which will take place at and around the barracks of Maribor, Celje and Ljubljana, and at the Divača airport. A platoon-sized unit will begin its training in Maribor on Tuesday, 18 May, and conclude it in Divača on Thursday, 20 May. The night-time training will be supported by an aircraft flying above 1,000 metres.
