## Subject: A Call for United Voices of First Ladies in Support of Gaza

Your Excellency,

I write to you with great humility and deep conviction, as a woman, as a partner of the Prime Minister of the Republic of Slovenia and as a sociologist by background. But above all I write as a human being who can no longer silently observe the devastation unfolding before our eyes.

Gaza has been a place of horrors with no safe haven for children, mothers, the elderly and persons with disabilities. Access to the most basic human needs — food, water, medicine, safety — has been shattered. Even their basic human right to life is being challenged.

History is being written in real time, and we, the women of public conscience, will either be remembered for using our position to demonstrate courage — or for our silence.

That is why I am reaching out to you today: not for politics, but for humanity. In this darkest hour, I believe it is time for us — the First Ladies — to unite our voices in a peaceful and powerful gesture of solidarity.

I invite you to join us in preparing a video message — a global collage of heartfelt statements by First Ladies — calling for the immediate end to violence and for the protection of every human life in Gaza. We are currently liaising with leading humanitarian organizations and international partners, including representatives from the United Nations, to support this effort and help amplify our message. In parallel, we are reaching out to global social advocacy platforms to ensure our message reaches millions through coordinated action across social media.

My intention is sincere and my goal is clear: to send a message to civilians in Gaza that they are not forgotten. To show moral leadership to global public. And most of all to influence our partners to demonstrate their leadership for peace and stop this war.

When us, the women in position to speak up, hearts are moved and the world listens. Silence, when left unchallenged, becomes complicity – and this unified message of peace will stand as a symbol of courage, conscience, and hope.

In a time when social media has the power to carry a message across the planet in seconds, the least we can do is to click "record" — and speak up for those who have no voice.

Your Excellency, dear colleague,

I would be deeply honoured, if you joined this effort. A united voice of First Ladies would be a powerful act of dignity, of peace, and of memory — for ourselves, for history, and most of all, for the children of Gaza.
