TRAFFICKING IN HUMAN BEINGS

IN THE REPUBLIC OF SLOVENIA IN THE PAST TEN YEARS (2010 - 2019)

Forms of trafficking in human beings for the purpose of exploitation:

- prostitution or other forms of sexual abuse
- forced labour
- engaging in criminal acts
- begging
- slavery
- servitude
- trafficking in human organs, tissues and blood
- trafficking in children

Trafficking in children:

- sexual exploitation of children (exploitation of children with the purpose of prostitution, photographs and videos of child sexual abuse, travel with the intention of sexual abuse of children)
- forced labour and labour exploitation of children
- exploitation of children for petty crime
- forced begging
- forced marriage of children
- trafficking in children's organs, tissues and blood
- illegal adoptions that can also be related to child abduction
- exploitation of children for serving in military forces or armed groups

Trafficking in human beings is a severe violation of fundamental human rights and a serious criminal offence

According to Article 113 of the Criminal Code of the Republic of Slovenia, **the act of purchasing another person**, taking possession of them as well as accommodating, transporting, selling, delivering or using them in any other way, regardless of their consent, or acting as a broker in such operations or maintaining control over them, is considered to be a criminal offence. In this context, exploitation shall be understood as exploitation of prostitution or another form of sexual abuse, forced labour, enslavement, servitude, performing criminal activities or trafficking in organs, human tissue or blood.

Victims of trafficking in human beings have the right to:

- appropriate and safe accommodation and assistance,
- material assistance,
- assistance in providing primary healthcare,
- psychosocial assistance and help,
- provision of information and counselling regarding the victims' rights, in a language understandable to the victims,
- recovery and reflection period,
- assistance in regularising legal status in Slovenia,
- assistance in integrating into Slovenian society,
- translation and interpreting services,
- assistance in the victims' return to their homeland.
